Background for the survey


- We wish to establish a test of the characteristics and overall ridability of a horse


- The survey was launched in May 2014 and ended (officially) in July 2014. Responses having arrived later have been included.



Respondents' main interest per country




What do we use our horse for?




Age vs country

Average age of respondents




- Belgium: 50% of respondents < 25 years old
- USA and Great Britain: more than 40% of respondents > 55 years old






Health – difference caused by eczema?




Height of the ideal leisure horse




How to define character

Top 6 of reasons NOT to buy a horse




How important is tölt?


4 questions about tölt:

- A leisure horse is, in my view, a horse which (choose the 6 most important characteristics out of 15, varying from gaits, to character, level of training)
- I would never buy a horse which (choose 3 out of 14, one option = doesn't tölt)
- When choosing between two horses to buy, I'd choose
 - A horse which can't tölt / which can't be ridden alone
 - A horse which can't tölt / which can't be ridden in groups








